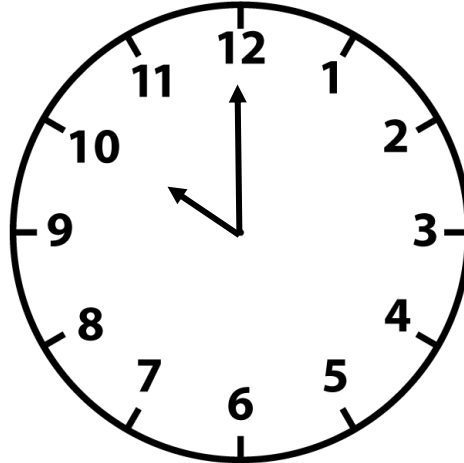
I'm going to Firstsite.



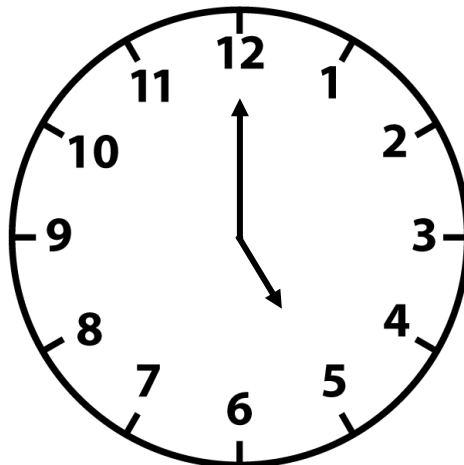
Firstsite is free to visit and I do not need to book a ticket.



Firstsite opens at 10:00am.



Firstsite closes at 5pm.

Ear defenders are available to borrow from the welcome desk on a first come first served basis.

When I go into the building there will be a big HELLO artwork.



On my left will be the Firstsite Shop.



I may have to queue before I can go into the shop.
I will need to sanitise my hands before going into the shop.



Straight ahead of me will be the Firstsite Welcome Desk where I will need to sign in as part of the NHS track and trace system.



I will need to sanitise my hands at the Welcome Desk.



I can follow the curve of the building where there are the gallery spaces, toilets and the café.



I will need to wear a face covering in the gallery unless I am exempt from doing so.



I will need to keep to 2 meters social distance in the gallery. I can use these floor markings to help me.



There are signs in the gallery to help me keep 2 meters social distance from other visitors.



In some areas of the gallery I will need to follow the one way system. These signs will help me to know when I need to follow a one way system.



I can use the arrows on the floor to help me follow the one way system around certain areas of the gallery.



The first toilets I will come across are either side of the green curved cinema.



There are more toilets further along the building and in the café.

At the end of the building, there is the Firstsite Café.



If I want to, I can buy a drink or something to eat and sit in the Café.



I can sit inside.



Or I can sit outside if the weather is nice.



I may need to queue and wait to be seated.

I do not need to wear a face mask in the Firstsite café.

I will need to sanitise my hands before going into the café.
